

Brief History of ACEF

Since 1990, ACEF has worked with BDP- our partner NGO in Bangladesh- for the education of children. Our activities began with the cooperation between Dr. Mina Marakarl and Rev. Yoshitaka Funato, which resulted in starting and operating a non-formal primary school for children who were unable to access education for various reasons.

After 30 years, we, together with BDP, have expanded our activities by operating vocational educational schools, scholarship programs for secondary education, and micro-financing businesses to support women.

When ACEF was established in 1990, there was only a 35% of adult literacy rate in Bangladesh. The founder of ACEF, Rev.Yoshitaka Hunato, who supported Bangladesh through the insurance/medical NGO at the time, and Dr.Mina Marakarl, felt the need for people to get a foundational education which resulted in starting primary education programs. This was due to the fact that people in Bangladesh were not able to prevent illness or receive health education since they could not read the description of medicines or the precautionary statements.

Dr.Marakarl initiated an educational program named "Sunflower Educational Program" in Dhaka in the International NGO World Concern. Also, Rev.Funato founded ACEF in Japan. Mr.Mikio Sumiya, a Tokyo University professor, was inaugurated as the first ACEF president as ACEF started the fundraising. In 1999, the "Sunflower Education Program" was renamed "Basic Development Partners (BDP)", and was registered as an NGO by the government of Bangladesh.
