Dignity Education Jeffrey Mensendiek Foreword

"It has been three years since ACEF started working on Dignity Education. By understanding Hick's "dignity model", we have been able to grasp dignity as a personal matter and see it as a part of our daily lives. I think there were two findings through the study of this dignity model. First is that the understanding of dignity is connected to our personal lives. The other finding is that the issues regarding dignity are actually fundamental issues to all of humankind. Every time I host a workshop, I learn more about the meaning and depth of dignity education. This is just the beginning of our journey together to create a society where everyone's dignity is respected. Why does ACEF take part in dignity education though? We will need to find the words to answer this question at some point. One answer that I can currently give now, is that the topic of dignity is gaining more recognition in the field of international cooperation. For example, we can see it in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the United Nations. The issues of dignity are also relevant in Japan. We must first be able to see the issues of dignity at work in our own personal lives. Also, we cannot learn about dignity without the people of Bangladesh. We have received such a rich connection with the people of Bangladesh. "Why does ACEF get involved in dignity education?" Through Dignity education, we are made aware of the value and preciousness of each person's existence- which is often not fully expressed in other terms such as "human rights".
